School Uniform/Gym Kit

It is disappointing to note that in recent months, there are an increasing number of pupils who are not wearing school uniform or appropriate/safe gym kit. Our uniform helps to promote the identity of our school in the local community and helps create an ethos of sharing and pride in Milton. In addition, the wearing of a uniform helps towards increasing the protection of all pupils. The wearing of a uniform helps staff and the pupils to distinguish between who belong to the school and those who may be visitors. This enables staff to approach and identify visitors more readily and helps in trying to offer a safer environment for pupils and teachers alike. It is important that children are also suitably dressed for PE. Trainers worn outside should not be worn for PE as this could prove to be a danger. Please note that jewellery should also be removed before PE sessions. Our uniform can be found in our handbook and school website, there are also many items (brand new) which can be found in our pre-loved rail too.

Transport Consultation

The consultation on the proposal to alter the distance that a mainstream secondary school pupil must live from their catchment school in order to qualify for free school transport from more than 2 miles to more than 3 miles is now open and runs until 1st March 2024. The link provides further information, including a response form, and advice on enrolling to attend a public meeting for those wishing to know more. Any proposed change would not take effect until August 2025. Paper copies are available in schools and libraries.
