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This week I was in classes and thought I'd share the work that I have seen in my 'daily wander'. Primary 1 and 2 had a lovely partnership lesson in PE and had to work cooperatively to make curved or straight lines with partners and groups together. Lots of talking and explanation going on that was very supportive of all in the group. I then had the pleasure of a presentation from Primary 3 on the lungs. The boys and girls made 3D models with straws and bags to show inhaling and exhaling - they were also able to tell me that our lungs are different sizes so there is space for our heart. I was also very impressed they were able to tell me that they knew bags should never be near our mouths!

Primary 4 wowed me with their coding skills in ICT and were able to explain how each command builds like a recipe until the final animation. Primary 5 were presenting their Eco models in groups to the class. They showed a great deal of knowledge about renewable energy and materials as well as being confident speakers and an encouraging audience.

Primary 6 had been outside as part of their Numeracy measurement lesson then took their learning back into class to convert different measurements from their outside work. Primary 7 were retelling their Lockerbie experiences and enjoyed reflecting on the activities, skills and achievements made last week.

Our school is always a hive of activity and it is wonderful to see it in action each day. As the weather improves, I know we are all looking forward to more outdoor/community learning to enhance skills, develop positive attitudes and raise attainment in all areas of the curriculum. I am very proud of all that I saw in classes this week - well done, boys and girls!
